ear Friends,

I've found myself immersed in the book of Nehemiah recently. It feels eerily similar to what the church of Jesus Christ is going through as we try to rebuild after our own "exile" during this pandemic. If you remember, the Israelites were returning from exile in Persia and threw themselves full-hog into rebuilding the walls of the city. After



just 52 days they had completed a wall around Jerusalem though it was not as high or wide or ornate as it had once been. In chapter 8 the people come together to celebrate what they have accomplished and to recommit their lives to God. There is this beautiful and touching scene where they are simultaneously weeping over all that's been lost, rejoicing in God's provision, and worshipping the God who is faithful.....ALL at the same time! Wow!

As I survey this past year (still in rebuilding mode) I feel a lot like those Israelites. Our programs are slowly re-emerging as we try to rebuild our committees and systems, entice folks back to regular, in-person worship and discern the shifting landscape of how church will be done differently in the future. Though I believe we will all be grieving, for years to come, the many things this pandemic took from us, I find myself simultaneously rejoicing at the all the new life we see springing up around us in these critical days. I don't know if I have ever enjoyed ministry more.

I thank God that I get to work with people like Lora East and the rest of our wise, dedicated staff and leadership. I am loving listening to Lora's sermons, whenever I'm not preaching, and have been in awe watching all these new young adults she has been attracting into our church and its leadership. After being terrified about Katheryne's retirement, Nancy and our choir have done SUCH a beautiful job drawing us all into a sweet and expectant spirit in worship. Small groups are flourishing, SCL has been epic, our people are caring for one another and my own kids are having a blast growing stronger in their faith under Charlie and Michelle's leadership. Our mission team keeps showing us, again and again, what it looks and feels like to care for our brothers and sisters around this city and globe. And we have found a new level of community engagement as we get more involved in Presbytery and open our doors to important work being done in the community. We even have new babies being born (welcome Anna Nancy!) If this is a taste of what this new landscape, this new church, will look like....count me ALL IN! Thank you for the unparalleled privilege of being one of your pastors for another year of growth, fellowship, faith and service!

One of my absolute favorite parts of my job is building community and deepening relationships – with God, and within our church family. 2023 was fantastic for the ministries I oversee: mission, adult



ministry, and pastoral care. This was really an amazing year for fun and fellowship, with many opportunities to serve, learn, celebrate, mourn, worship, and just enjoy being in each other's company. God is so good!

I was also installed as Moderator of our Presbytery in February for a one year term, which included a pastoral installation in Hawaii, and a pastoral ordination in Hollywood.



WORSHIP & Music





The year began with Nancy Reeves starting as the new Director of Worship and Arts in February, after serving almost twenty years in the BPC music department in various roles. Almost immediately, she jumped in by casting and starting weekly rehearsals for a Godspell performance set for May.

The Lenten season started with a beautiful Ash Wednesday service. A major change to the chancel was engineered by Michael Grieg and Randy Johnson, by switching the choir and band positions around for a better view and sound. The choir performed the touching music of Shadows by Douglas Wagner at the Maundy Thursday service where we had pastors from Pali Presbyterian Church join us. Congregants and pastors then attended a Good Friday service at Pali Pres. And we had two joyful Easter services with a growing number of people coming back to in-person worship.

April through July was a blur of illness and deaths in the family for Nancy, but Linda Regan-Johnson (new Elder to Worship), Jefferson Denim, Carol Maddon and Amy Brachmann, plus the amazing choir, kept the music and praise going during it all and served with grace and joy! The Godspell performance was postponed.

Summertime brought back one 10am service and our Summer Socials, which were even better than the previous summer somehow! The Resilient Faith Podcast, under Janice McOueen Ward's faithful hand.







continued to put out thought-provoking podcasts weekly. Thanks to Cameron Ward for the music and editing and to Pastor Lora!

In August we began the Gospel According to Taylor Swift sermon series, which focused on her song lyrics and how they connected to Bible teachings. Each sermon featured a song and video which brought a different, fun vibe to the services. Stewardship season followed and we celebrated the arts by bringing in our Social Media person, Vineta Rendler, to create in real time a beautiful painting that shows how interconnected we all are. What a special event that was! During that time we brought on board Olivia Tenhouten

to direct the Grace Notes Choir, who rehearsed after the 2nd service.

Before we knew it Advent was upon us and the choir prepared for and sung a glorious concert of The Voices of Christmas by Joseph M. Martin. Our handbells, under Amy Brachmann's guidance, came back playing even more difficult music and wowing the congregation with their new techniques. Just before Christmas we gathered to go caroling to several homes and were greeted with warm smiles, hugs and even a few tears. Such a lovely way to see our church members who can't make it to church regularly! Christmas Eve fell on a Sunday with both a morning service and two evening services, with solos, handbells, Grace Notes Choir and a Christmas lobster! There were over 500 in attendance plus more online!

is our FAITH in Action

The Mission Team supports local, national, and international organizations through both financial and hands-on opportunities to walk side-by-side with those in need. These are partnerships where we serve and contribute to the well-being of others. We also learn from them and grow in our faith through relationships. Our monthly Mission Team meetings were conducted both in person and via Zoom.

Our 2023 involvement was in the following areas:

- Hope on Union/United University Church presented opportunities to work at the Food Pantry. Led by Pastor Lora and Pastor Sunny Kang, there were weekly distributions of food to 250-400 people (each supporting 3.8 persons which is food for 950-1520 people).
- Habitat for Humanity on August 12 conducted a workday for eight new homes on 215 E. El Segundo Blvd in Willowbrook area of LA (7 volunteers)
- Sack Lunches for residents at the Santa Monica Shelter/The People Concern (4-8 volunteers)
- Conducted monthly Zoom calls to stay connected to our community in Bluefields, Nicaragua pastoral group (APASUR). Attended occasional Zoom calls with Westside Coalition, Presbytery Taskforce on Homelessness, Brentwood Community Council, Pacific Palisades Taskforce on Homelessness (PPTFH), Medical Benevolence Foundation (MBF).
- Assembled and delivered 225 **Thanksgiving Bags** (900 meals) to five (5) organizations including People Concern, Village for Vets, My Friends Place, Westminster TLC, and Westminster Church. Those agencies distributed the bags to their unhoused clientele.
- The Angel Store and 10,000 Villages Craft Market were held in December allowing over 20 people to volunteer their time over two weekends. The Angel Store was conducted in person and online, while 10,000 Villages was here in person. We gave your support to 16 different local and international ministries.
 - Hosted **The Giving Spirit** December 15-17.
- Hosted Music Mends Minds for their Valentine's Sing Along on February 11 and their Christmas Concert on December 9. Music Mends Minds

meets weekly in the Sanctuary.

- Special Offerings supported Medical Benevolence Foundation, Music Mends Minds, Maui Fire Relief, and CEPAD.
- All Church Mexico Trip occurred October 7-9 through AMOR Ministries. Steve Ruth and Rev. Lora East participated. 26 people (including 10-12 youth) participated in constructing a 3-room house for a deserving family with 3 boys. Rev. Matt Hardin from Palisades Presbyterian church and 3 of his members also participated.
- Westminster TLC 6 people helped with clean up and organization of the Reading Room on July 29
- Marathon of Service on the weekend of March 18 included, Habitat build (10 volunteers) sack lunches (120 meals/17 volunteers). Westminster TLC (6 volunteers), Westside Food Bank (15-18 volunteers including youth), work at the church through Facilities.
 - · Nicaragua/Bluefields Partnership
- Rev. Lora East, Tom Elander and Steve Ruth visited with our partners in Nicaragua February 27 — March 5. Part of the visit was to celebrate 50 years of CEPAD.
- Hosted **Anita Taylor** from CEPAD for Church and a luncheon on September 3. She discussed her work in Nicaragua that BPC Supports.
- Participated in the Volunteer Collectives "Layer Up" campaign to provide warm clothing for people across Los Angeles September 15-25. Assisted with sorting clothing on October 14-15.
- Hosted mission partners the Boyds for church and a luncheon after where they discussed their work in Africa/Democratic Republic of Congo.
- Prepared and served meals at Hollywood Presbyterian Seasonal Refuge Center on June 6
- Supported the Amy (Biel) Foundation in South Africa with a donation to their work.
 - Participated in "Time and Talent" Sunday on October 22nd.
- Scheduled speakers and **videos** for mission projects to be shown in Sunday services.
- Updated the Mission webpage for ease of navigation and to highlight our mission partners.

- We took a group of youth students back to Mexico for the first time since 2019 on the Fall Mexico Mission Trip in October, where we helped Amor Ministries build a home for Maribel Mondragon and her three children, with help from her sons Josue and Azael.




Thanks so much for inviting me to be a part of the BPC family, partnering with you in the ministry of our students. Looking forward to 2024!

FACILITIES Committee



The Facilities Committee is comprised of Ted Calinson, Jack Dell, Roxee Graves, Leo Press, Carolyn Thacker, Gordon Treharne, JP LoMonaco, Tony Talbot, and Lynn Whitaker. Cris Clark serves as Flder.

The team is responsible for all aspects of repairs, maintenance, and upgrades to the entire BPC campus. This includes the insurance, buildings, landscaping, furnishings, fixtures, and equipment, as well as the parking garage. The Team also oversees and approves all uses of the Facility by outside groups such as the Boy Scouts USA, The Giving Sprit, AA and other 12-Step programs, and Music Mends Minds.

In addition to the main BPC campus, Facilities is responsible for the care, landscaping, and upgrades to our two Pastor's Manses. One is occupied by the Carpenter family, in Brentwood, and the other, in Santa Monica, is currently rented.

The scope of responsibility for the Team means continuous involvement with every member of BPC, our entire staff, and the Pre-school. The Team is supported by our incredible Custodial group, led by Jerry Rosas. Diego Padilla, Fernando Luna, and Paul



Tatosian complete that team. Other support for Facilities comes from Pat Nahigian and Ella Wagner, who field and coordinate all inquiries for use from outside groups and create the church Master Calendar. Farrah Mikail handles our finances and payments to vendors.

The team meets weekly, usually on Zoom, but all members can be found on site working on special projects. 2023 projects have been many and varied. Our biggest project was the complete replacement of the roof on the Sanctuary building with a new faux shake roof that has a 50 year warranty. Other projects included replacement of the porch and mold and mildew remediation for the Avondale manse, emergency water heater replacement at both the BPC campus and Avondale, refurbishment and upgrading of our monument sign on the corner of San Vicente and Bundy, a lot of sprinkler pipe repairs, landscaping upgrades,

refinishing of the Garden gates, repainting of all exterior Sanctuary trim, upgrading of room 222 to be rented as an office, and repairs to the flooring in Fellowship Hall due to damage from the winter rains.

Tony Talbot has done all the heavy lifting at the BPC campus for several years, and has been very instrumental in providing training and ongoing education for our Custodial team. e expect expenses to exceed income again this year, but our balance sheet is still strong enough to support investment in BPC's future growth, care for each other, and spreading the Good News, while we also position ourselves for graceful downsizing in the future, if necessary.

We've emphasized investment in staying fully staffed, keeping our current great team and replacing those who've left.

Major unexpected expenses from last year include replacing the Sanctuary roof, and continuing repair of mold damage to the Sanctuary and to the Avondale Manse. A large addition to our endowment fund should help prevent and mitigate such disasters in the future.

We are also working to make unused space on the BPC campus more productive, and to re-think management of our endowment funds to align them more closely with BPC priorities.

Finance Committee

The Finance Committee oversees BPC's annual budget and long-term investments, and assists the Financial Officer with managing financial details.

Endowment Committee

The Endowment Committee, a subcommittee of the Finance Committee, accepts endowment gifts, invests them appropriately, and manages distributions from those investments to reflect the donors' wishes.
