



## STEWARDSHIP

The theme of our Stewardship campaign this year was Giving Generously. The 2025 Annual Pledge is at \$763,061, which is a 2% increase from the 2024 Annual Pledge of \$747,129.

In fact, we hope you will join in several areas, or as BPC likes to call it "Membership + 2" encouraging you to attend weekly church services and participate in two areas that are of interest to you.

As a member of the Welcome and Connecting committee, there are fun and fulfilling events and ways to serve. During the summer months we participated in the weekly after church patio party and hosted the "Paris Olympics Party". We also were a part of BPC's Time and Talent Fair, sharing a table with the Worship Committee and providing specific information on our committee's purpose, goals and responsibilities.

## INISSION is our FAITH in Action

The Mission Team supports local, national, and international organizations through both financial and hands-on opportunities to walk side-by-side with those in need. These are partnerships where we serve and contribute to the well-being of others. We also learn from them and grow in our faith through relationships. Our monthly Mission Team meetings were conducted both in person and via Zoom. Our 2024 involvement was in the following areas:

## HOPE ON UNION/UNITED UNIVERSITY CHURCH presented opportunities to work at the Food Pantry. Led by Pastor Lora and Pastor Supply Kang, there were weekly.

by Pastor Lora and Pastor Sunny Kang, there were weekly distributions of food to 250-400 people (each supporting 3.8 persons which is food for 950-1520 people).





#### HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

We conducted two (2) workdays this past year under our Covenant Agreement with Habitat. At our Marathon of Service on March 16 (see below) Ten (10) volunteers worked at the construction site of eight (8) new houses on W. El Segundo Blvd in the Willowbrook area of LA (see photo). We also had six (6) volunteers work at the ReStore location on La Brea. On July 27 we had ten (10) volunteers at a new construction site of eight (8) homes at 1750 E 63rd St in LA and six (6) volunteers at the ReStore on LaBrea.

- Conducted monthly Zoom calls to stay connected to our community in Bluefields, Nicaragua pastoral group (APASUR). Attended occasional Zoom calls with Westside Coalition, Presbytery Taskforce on Homelessness, Medical Benevolence Foundation (MBF).
- Assembled and delivered 275 Thanksgiving Bags (1100 meals) to five (5) organizations including People Concern,
   Village for Vets, Safe Place for Youth (S.P.Y.), Westminster TLC, and Westminster Church. Those agencies distributed the bags to their unhoused clientele.
- The Angel Store and 10,000 Villages Craft Market were held in December allowing over 20 people to volunteer their time over two weekends. The Angel Store was conducted in person and online, while 10,000 Villages was here in person. We gave your support to 13 different local and international ministries.
  - Hosted **The Giving Spirit** December 12-15.
- Hosted Music Mends Minds for their Christmas Concert on December 7. Music Mends Minds meets weekly in the Sanctuary.
- Special Offerings supported **The People Concern**, **Medical Benevolence Foundation** (Haiti), Safe Place for **Youth** (S.P.Y.) and **Amor**.
- **WESTSIDE FOOD BANK:** 18 people packed up 382 meal kits for distribution to those whose kids rely on this for summer meals.



 ALL CHURCH **MEXICO TRIP** occurred October 12-14 through **AMOR Ministries. Steve** Ruth and Rev. Lora Fast participated. 26 people (including 10-12 youth) participated in constructing a 3-room house for a deserving family selected by local pastors Palisades Presbyterian Church was also invited to participate and one (1) of their members also participated.



- Westminster TLC, 6 people helped with clean up
- Marathon of Service on March 14, 16-17 included, Habitat ReStore (6 volunteers), cooking and serving dinner at SaMoShel (6 volunteers), Westminster TLC (6 volunteers), Westside Food Bank (15-18 volunteers including youth), work at the church through Facilities, Hollywood Presbyterian Winter Refuge Center (20 people served, 6 volunteers (and Tom Graham's guitar).
  - Nicaragua/Bluefields Partnership
    Hosted our partners from CEPAD and Bluefields for a week in January. The three (3) visitors were hosted by Tom & Nancy Elander and Cessie Barbour. There were activities planned each day to introduce them to our local ministries and church activities and groups.
- Prepared and served meals at Hollywood Presbyterian
   Seasonal Refuge Center on March 14, Tom Graham sang and played guitar as entertainment.
- Scheduled speakers and videos for mission projects to be shown in Sunday services.
- Updated the **Mission webpage** for ease of navigation and to highlight our mission partners.





BPC Children's Ministry supports the children & families of our church by providing faith-based education in a safe, loving & nurturing environment. Children experience God's love, grow their faith & create healthy relationships with God, others & themselves.

We provide Sunday school activities & spiritual enrichment to Pre-K children during the 8:00 and 10:30 services. Children in K-5 join their parents in worship at 10:30, then are dismissed to classrooms after the Children's message where they hear a Bible story & have activities that reinforce the weekly message.

Fun annual events include Vacation Bible School, making Living Easter Baskets, Halloween Meet & Greet, Night in Bethlehem and the Christmas Pageant.





## YOUTH MINISTRY

The BPC Youth Ministry provides a Christ-centered community where 6th-12th graders grow in faith, build relationships, and live out their beliefs. With 17 students in confirmation this year, we are joyfully guiding them as they deepen their faith and affirm their commitment to Christ.

The BPC Youth program offers fellowship and service opportunities that bring faith to life. Forest Home retreats where students connect with God and each other.

Opportunities to Serve (OTS) at places like The Giving Spirit and Westside Food Bank where they put their faith into action. Our youth grow spiritually, have fun, build friendships, while making a meaningful impact in their community.

The Facilities Committee is led by Dave Hibbert as Elder. The members include Ted Calinson, Gary Slacum, Roxee Graves, Leo Press, Carolyn Thacker, Gordon Treharne, Cris Clark, Tony Talbot, and Lynn Whitaker.

The team is responsible for all aspects of repairs, maintenance, and upgrades to the entire BPC campus. This includes the insurance, buildings, landscaping, furnishings, fixtures, and equipment, as well as the parking garage. The Team also oversees and approves all uses of the Facility by outside groups such as the Boy Scouts USA, The Giving Sprit, AA and other 12-Step programs, and Music Mends Minds.

In addition to the main BPC campus, Facilities is responsible for the care, landscaping, and upgrades to our two Pastor's Manses. One is occupied by the Carpenter family, in Brentwood, and the other, in Santa Monica, is currently rented. Pastor Lora preferred to live in a smaller unit in Westwood.

The scope of responsibility for the Team means continuous involvement with every member of BPC, our entire staff, and the Pre-school. The Team is supported by our incredible Custodial group, led by Gerry Rosas, with assistance from Diego Padilla, and Paul Tatosian. Other support for Facilities came from Pat Nahigian and Ella Wagner, who field and coordinate all inquiries for use from outside groups and create the church Master Calendar. Jana David is the Director of Facilities. Finances and payments to vendors are







handled by Farrah Mikail/Sue Haldeman.

The team meets weekly, usually on Zoom, but all members can be found on site working on special projects. 2024 projects have been many and varied.

The largest projects were the repair and replacement of damaged joists in the Sanctuary, followed by replacement of the carpet, and replacement of the roof on Fellowship Hall. Other projects included mold and mildew remediation in the Sanctuary building, upgrades to all the exterior BPC campus lighting to provide increased security, and general repairs at both manses.

Tony Talbot has done all the heavy lifting at the BPC campus for several years, and has been very instrumental in providing training and ongoing education for our Custodial team. It is noted that in addition to normal Custodial duties, this group provides security, and

large percent of BPC's reserves dedicated to specific programs we have another (small) budget deficit for 2025. A handful of items could be covered by a healthy growth in endowments last year, but for the future we need to enhance our income and prioritize the ways our funds are spent. Sale of the 28th St. Manse in favor of more profitable investments should help for the next couple of years.

#### **FINANCE COMMITTEE**

In addition to reviewing BPC's monthly financial statements and maximizing the value of our bank accounts, this year the Finance Committee is working on aligning the budget with available Designated accounts and Endowment funds for long-term maintenance of BPC's most valuable programs.

#### **ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE**

The Endowment Committee manages BPC's Endowment accounts for maximum return on investment consistent with its social responsibility and environmental sustainability goals. In addition it distributes grants via BPC's ministries, this year including:
